Contextualization

SOUNDS OF TRADITION

Four different pieces and styles are sharing connections with the traditional folk songs and dances for different sites of the world. Also all these pieces are were composed in different age so during the performance you can feel a big contrast.

If we analyze the music of Carmen Fantasy you can see the lights of the Spanish folk songs, with Aragonnaise or even Pasodoble, the character of the tradition into the music. In addition of the Opera's plot, the music has a big relation with spanish rythm and melodies.

Even if it's a contemporary piece, like Playful Scenes, you can feel the rythm of a kind of folk song from Galicia, the Muiñeira, represented by a late motiev rythmn similar to the Italian Saltarello.

Also in Nielsen's Clarinet Concerto the groot of the rythm and melody come from a big tradition deep according to a Doctoral research by Dougles Monroe published in The University of Ohio.

Even the Molter's Clarinet Concerto has a big relation with the Barroque Suites, a mix of deep tradition of slow and fast french dances. The continuum of the rythm it's perceptibly during the Concerto.
