### Helia Golmaghani Azar, Flute

Sounds of Mithras is a five-movement work inspired by the ancient Persian deity Mithras and the elemental forces of Water, Soil, Wind, Fire, and Cosmos. Blending Persian musical traditions, particularly the modal language of the dastgāh; with modern techniques, the piece traces a symbolic journey through nature and spirit.

Each movement reflects the character of its element: fluid ornamentation in Water, earthy modal grounding in Soil, breath-like textures in Wind, rhythmic intensity in Fire, and expansive unity in Cosmos.
