

Celebrate 100 Years of the Old Auditorium!

The 2025/2026 Season will be dedicated to all those who came together to build the UBC Campus at Point Grey and our glorious Old Auditorium! To celebrate the 100 Years of the Old Auditorium we have a wonderful set of performances and events!

In 1925, the UBC Point Grey Campus opened. One of the first buildings to be completed was the Old Auditorium. It was the cultural and social focal point of that new campus. I always find it very interesting that one of the first buildings to be erected was a theatre!

WWI veterans who were students at UBC played a pivotal role during the first years of the new campus. They formed the Returned Soldier's Club and, together with Alumni, Faculty, Senate, Board of Governors and President Klinck, made an appeal to the Dominion Government for financial aid so these returned soldiers could pursue their university studies. After the Second World War in 1945/1946 veterans' registration at UBC doubled. Music was a solace to the soldiers and the civilians during WWI and WWII, helping people endure immeasurable grief and sadness. After the war the healing powers of music, the importance of people gathering together, to laugh, to grieve, to live again and especially to further their education, was of utmost importance. This all led to the construction of this wonderful Old Auditorium. Of course, it was new then, sporting a stain glass dome in the centre of the theatre ceiling. Seats arrived late so the first classes had to sit on the floor but they were there in time for the celebrations on October 14 and 15 of 1925! Over the past 25 years, thanks to the Veterans Transition Program at UBC, the student population of veterans is once again increasing.

Graduations were held at the Old Aud, speakers and performers of distinction were welcomed, such as Eleanor Roosevelt, Paul Robson, Dylan Thomas, and much later Judith Forst and Ben Heppner. Following them a new generation of opera singers, including me, fell in love with the Old Aud. Our devotion to the Old Aud was instrumental in preventing this grand old theatre from being torn down in 1997 after the Chan Centre was built. Sixteen years after that, we began a campaign to raise awareness of this historic UBC gem, and to its importance to the students' opera education. We raised a major part of the twenty-one

million dollars to have it renovated. The growth and success of the UBC Opera Program inspired the university and donors to create a centre for aspiring opera singers from all over our great nation as well as throughout the world. After major renovations it reopened in 2010. This 'new' Old Aud is the home of the UBC Opera Ensemble. We now have UBC Opera Alumni performing, teaching, directing, creating new works, leading opera companies, working in the medical and legal fields, scientific and arts research, arts administration, music and education. Our Alumni are all over the world. Once again, the Old Aud is a hub for cultural, educational, social and community activities for UBC and the Lower Mainland. International Opera Stars of today have graced the stage of the Old Aud, to name a few: Sondra Radvanovsky, Javier Camarena, Angela Meade, Luca Pisaroni, Eric Owens, Jane Archibald, Simone Osborne, and Gordon Bintner. The closing scene of Julia Robert's film "Wonder" was filmed at the Old Aud and the Opera Ensemble appeared in "The Amazing Race Canada" which was filmed at the Old Aud. This incredible theatre is looking forward to the next 100 years and the thousands of students and professional performers, national and international speakers and celebrities of all kinds who will grace its stage. The Old Auditorium will welcome our faithful audiences of the past, present and future and together we will applaud this wonderful old theatre which has survived and thrived for 100 years at UBC!!

Singspiel Opera in Two Acts Sung in German with English Surtitles





Opera Seria in Three Acts Sung in Italian with English Surtitles



We celebrate the 100th Anniversary featuring Internationally recognized Canadian Mezzo-Soprano, **Emily D'Angelo**. D'Angelo opened the 2024/2025 Metropolitan Opera Season as Jess, the leading role in *Grounded*, an opera written specifically for her. In 2025, she won a Juno award for her recent recording and "The NY Times" calls her "one of the world's special young singers." She is the first and only vocalist to have been presented with the Leonard Bernstein Award from the Schleswig Holstein Festival. She returns this season to the Staatsoper Berlin, Wiener Staatsoper, Bayerische Staatsoper and the Metropolitan Opera.

'The True North Strong and Free' Recognition Event: The Veteran Trek to UBC Continues – Then, Now and Going Forward

October 15, 2025 - 7:00pm, Old Auditorium

We honour the Great Trek – past and present! The UBC Opera Ensemble, Historians of UBC and Members of the Veterans Transition Program present an evening of music, stories and film from 1925 to 2025. Tickets ranging from \$20–\$35. Bundle both events together to save!

On this **second night** of celebration, we pay tribute to some of the first and most influential students of UBC - these were the 197 WWI soldiers and veterans who enrolled as students at UBC. They formed the Returned Soldier's Club and together with Alumni, Faculty, Senate, Board of Governors and President Klinck made an appeal to the Dominion Government for financial aid so these returned soldiers could pursue their university studies. In the session 1944/1945, the registration was 3,058, of whom 150 were ex-service personnel. In 1945/1946, registration almost doubled with 2,254 veterans in a total student body of 5,621. Twenty-five years ago, Doctor Marv Westwood created the Veterans Transition Program here at the UBC Faculty of Education and again the number of veterans on our campus today began to increase. This program has transformed the lives of thousands of veterans not only here in BC and Canada but in the United States, England and Germany. We pay tribute to all of these veterans past and present. They all helped to shape the future of UBC and our society then and now. We honour our Armed Forces who defend and protect us in this troubled world today at home and abroad. We applaud all those involved in the Veterans Transition Program who enable our veterans to return to a meaningful and productive civilian life.
